ORDER

THIS CAUSE came before the Court upon Receiver Jonathan E. Perlman, Esq.’s Motion to Compel Production of Documents from Precision Aerospace Group fka TCA Aerospace LLC [ECF No. 168], filed on August 19, 2021. The Receiver seeks an order compelling Precision Aerospace Group (“PAG”) to produce documents responsive to a subpoena served on July 13, 2021. The Receiver advises these documents are essential for the Receiver to make an informed decision about whether to pursue expansion of the Receivership over PAG’s parent company. The Receiver contends he is entitled to review the requested documents under Sections III and IV of the Court’s May 11, 2020 Appointment Order [ECF No. 5] as well as a separate security agreement with PAG. The Court having reviewed the Motion and being otherwise fully advised, it is


ORDERED AND ADJUDGED as follows:

1. The Motion [ECF No. 168] is **GRANTED**.
2. Within seven (7) days of this Order, PAG shall produce all documents requested in the Subpoena [ECF No. 168-1].

3. The Receiver is entitled to an award of reasonable fees and costs incurred bringing the Motion. Within seven (7) days of this Order, the Receiver shall file an affidavit of the reasonable fees and costs incurred and submit a proposed order awarding the same.¹
